

Into the Woods! Field Trip to the Forest Preserve October 25 BY Mary Naftzger



Along with our invaluable staff, Rod and Ava, 18 of us rode a comfortable bus to the Sagawau Environmental Learning Center (unique among the Cook County Forest Preserves) in Lemont. The woods, prairie patches and water- filled quarries were a delight to view from various trails. The highlight of the visit, at least for us bird lovers, was a session with the bird banding staff. The birds had already been caught via a net and then one by one taken out of their breathable bag to be identified and then banded. A big screen let us see what the bird bander was looking for in the wing and other feathers to identify and record if it was male or female, a spring hatchling, an older bird or one with disease or injury. Then

we all were able to see the birds up close, touch them and even release them back to the wild. How fascinating!
