

All discussion will be confidential. The format will be a drop-in, which means you can come when you wish, as often as you wish. 

Cornell Village, an intergenerational complex located in Hyde Park, has developed a kind of "Village within a Village" program that might interest others. Sammie Dortch, a Cornell Village resident and one of the initial program organizers has shared the following description of how a contained housing facility can support an age inclusive community.

Two years ago a small group of residents began collaborating with Chicago Hyde Park Village (CHPV), SHARE (Southside Healthy Aging Resource Experts), and Off the Pews (an intergenerational faith-based initiative focused on applying a "village" concept to addressing youth violence). They now hold quarterly sessions on site including a healthy meal and presentations on topics such as healthy aging across generations (e.g., from children through working and retired adults); financial literacy and estate planning; the relationship between Western and Eastern medicine; holistic health, and the benefits of diet and exercise. The program has become a perk of living in the community.
