## Volunteer

Why is the Village charging fees? Villages, like all enterprises, whether for-profit or not-for-profit, need money on hand to keep their doors open. CHPV gets as much as possible donated, but it is						
not possible to get everything donated. CHPV uses membership fees to pay the rent on our office,						
telephone, printing and copying, insurance, vetting fees for volunteers, and other costs related to						
Village activities. In addition, we feel it is essential for our Village to have paid staff in order to run						

smoothly. Membership fees will guarantee that we can pay staff and all associated payroll and unemployment taxes.
